COMPETITION MANAGEMENT & CLUB DEVELOPMENT MANAGER'S REPORT

2008 was a year where the benefits of new initiatives and an increased focus on parts of our operational model at the end of the previous season started to bear fruit.

Each year we strive to reinforce and build upon previous standards which are reviewed annually as we work to build upon the quality of the AFL Sydney competition. In a number of different ways we are seeing examples of that.

It would be imprudent to suggest that we are satisfied with where we are at; rather we are confident that what we as a community are working towards collaboratively is headed in the right direction.

Particular matters that should be mentioned in reflecting on 2008 include:

- The revised Strategic Goals & Objectives document for AFL Sydney has been shared with all clubs and we will shortly commence the first of the annual reviews.
- An agreed Licensing system that reflects on the expectations and commitments from all concerned has been put into place.
- The Club Umpire System formally put in to place this year has been well supported in general with Clubs recognising the difficulties in sourcing the number of accredited umpires necessary. The result of training and allocation of club based umpires has been regarded as a very positive initiative.
- A better system of recognising the best practice efforts of clubs during the year saw all clubs receiving a level of financial recognition through the Club of the Year scheme. That, along with the reintroduction of Club Champion and Premiership rewards, has been positively received. In addition to these initiatives increased funding from AFL NSW/ACT through extended resources at all levels of football will translate into positive benefits to AFL Sydney in both the short and long term.
- Following on from the growth of Under 18's football, more analysis and pathway transition from junior to senior football has provided clubs with more valuable information upon which to base recruitment for Under 18's. A new document on pathway transition will be released shortly across both senior and junior football clubs. The content articulates the benefits of having a formal program of support from both senior and junior clubs.
- The initiative to formalise support agreements between Premier Division and First Division clubs has seen both Nor-West and East Coast recognising the positive value of such. This is subsequent to similar discussions between North Shore and Manly-Warringah that has similar objectives. The proposition of clubs entering into regional arrangements is strongly supported by AFL Sydney.
- The representative program stepped up another level this year and all involved are to be congratulated. It is our desire to maintain that momentum.

- Going forward we will be presented with the challenges that stem from the Western Sydney license initiative. The positive impacts on AFL Sydney are likely to evolve as increased resource levels to support the foundation, again at all levels of football become apparent. That said, our eye has not been taken off the ball right across the Sydney region.
- A substantial amount of analysis and engagement has taken place around the competition structure review this year. Whilst this has been a subject that has been raised previously we now have better access to historical information, much of which formed the basis of the review. The level of detail and analysis has provided a compelling case for introducing a more effective structure for AFL Sydney in 2009 and beyond.

Finally, all these initiatives and positive outcomes do not just happen. We thank the Clubs for their increased engagement and support. The effort of the Competition & Club Development team in supporting AFL Sydney has been outstanding. I would like to personally thank Garry Burkinshaw, Alana Shackleton and Chris Mintern for their efforts in raising the quality of support and leadership for AFL Sydney.

SENIOR FOOTBALL OPERATIONS OFFICER'S REPORT

The 2008 season has come and gone and it is now time to review the year and prepare for 2009.

Congratulations to the 2008 Premiers; Pennant Hills in Premier Division Seniors, East Coast Eagles in Premier Division Reserves, UTS in First Division Seniors & Reserves, North Shore Bombers in Under 18's Premier Cup, UNSW/ES in Under 18's Challenge Cup and Pennant Hills in Second Division. All Grand Finals were well contested and played in the right spirit and it was pleasing to see the number of people who turned out to support their team, not only in the finals but throughout the season.

Congratulations also to UNSW/ES and UTS on winning the Club Championship award in Premier Division and First Division, respectively. This is a fantastic achievement and recognises the on-field performance of a club as a whole, as opposed to individual teams.

The Club Championship Award was introduced as part of the restructure of the Club of the Year program. In past years a clubs on field and off field performances were combined to establish the Club of the Year. 2008 saw the Club Championship Award introduced to reward on field performance whilst the Club of the Year Incentive Scheme was implemented to reward clubs who achieved excellence in administration and other off field areas. This year \$31,467.00 was returned to the clubs under the new Club of the Year program.

Preparing for the 2008 season commenced whilst the 2007 season was still in progress with all clubs requested to participate in a process called "Towards 2008". This involved all clubs making suggestions on ways AFL Sydney could be improved in areas such as Competition Structure, Administration, Under 18's, Umpires, Representative Football etc. Once the clubs made their suggestions these were then collated and sent to the clubs for comment. Clubs then responded to this request, the responses were summarised and sent to clubs. The major issues identified were placed on the agenda for the Annual Planning Meeting which was held in October. Aside from the Towards 2008 items, a number of issues were discussed that aimed at improving AFL Sydney.

Some of the major changes included introducing a rule which restricted the number of Under 16's players who could play in the Under 18's competitions to four (4) per team per game. Players who were on scholarship or selected in the Under 16's Talented Player Program were exempt from this rule. The aim of the rule was to keep Under 16's footballers in the junior system for a longer period of time and hopefully strengthen the Under 16's competitions. There was also a slight amendment to the rule regarding the minimum number of on field players for the Under 18's competitions. Whilst the minimum number remained at 16 on field players, if both sides had more than 18 players named on their team list, the game had to be played with 18 on field players, as opposed to 2007 when both clubs had to agree to play more than 16 on field players. These changes were well managed and proved quite beneficial to both Under 18's competitions.

Other changes included the introduction of a final five for the Premier Division and Under 18 Premier Cup competitions, time on was introduced for all finals matches and amendments to the send off rule which enabled players who receive a red card to be replaced only after a period of 15 minutes had elapsed. All these changes worked well.

Another significant change was that the Under 18's players did not need to re-register each year. This arrangement is the same that has been in place with senior players for some time and saved a significant amount of administration workload for club officials. Also as part of this change, any Under 18's player who wished to transfer from one AFL Sydney club to another required a clearance from their previous club.

Individual reviews were held with each club, also in October. The reviews included discussions about their on and off field performances in 2007, financial position, plans for 2008 as well and any AFL Sydney issues they wished to raise. The reviews were well received and will continue moving forward.

During the off season the By-Laws were reviewed and updated. This was a tedious process and I would like to thank all those involved.

2008 also saw the production of an Operations Handbook. The booklet was in A5 format and included AFL Sydney Information, club contacts, By-Laws and AFL NSW/ACT Regulations, Transfer Regulations (including Interstate and also AFL Sydney – VCFL Transfer Regulations), AFL Sydney Tribunal Rules and Guidelines (the Guidelines were written to assist clubs in better understanding the Tribunal Rules and requirements), AFL Sydney 2008 Fixtures and the Laws of Australian Football 2008.

Footyweb continued to play an important role in the AFL Sydney Competition Management and membership database. At the beginning of the season all clubs were provided with a laptop to assist with the clubs requirements in relation to Footyweb. The clubs were required to maintain their own membership database and match day requirements. This included inputting new registrations, printing off team sheets prior to each match and, at the conclusion of the each match day, the home club inputting match scores, goalkickers and best players of all matches by 9pm on match day. Most clubs exceeded this expectation and it was not uncommon that by 7pm on matchday all match details were able to be viewed via the website. AFL Sydney is arguably the leaders in this field and it is well received by football followers around Australia as well as overseas. Thank you to all clubs for their efforts.

Prior to the season starting there were also the Annual Football Operations and Coaches meetings whilst Presidents meetings were held in February and July. The Coaches meeting also outlined the expectations and requirements relating to the Talented Player Programs. These meeting were all important in ensuring the competition ran as smoothly as possible and I believe they achieved their objectives.

Arguably the biggest change in 2008 was the introduction of a more structured and professional Club Field Umpire Program. Club field umpires is nothing new, with many lower grade matches umpired by club representatives on a regular basis in the past. This year only Premier Division Seniors, First Division Seniors and Under 18's Premier Cup received a full compliment of Appointed Field Umpires. All other competitions consisted of one Appointed Field Umpire as well as a Registered Field Club Umpire from each club.

To become a Registered Club Field Umpire, the club representative must hold a current umpire accreditation or attended a Club Umpire Training Seminar. Carl Fletcher (Umpires Development Officer) conducted 17 Seminars prior to the season commencing. 260 people attended the seminars and become Registered Club Field Umpires with 94 of these umpiring during the year. AFL Sydney provided the clubs with green shirts, black socks and a whistle for their club field umpires.

The 2008 Premier Division Competitions were unchanged from 2007 with ten teams. Camden made a return to AFL Sydney after playing in the South Coast competition and their inclusion saw the First Division competitions increase to eight teams. The Under 18's Premier Cup competition commenced with ten teams, with St Ignatius College, Riverview being promoted after winning the Challenge Cup in 2007. All Premier Division clubs fielded teams in this competition except for the two Universities, whilst North Shore fielded two teams, the Bombers and the Bears. Balmain Dockers withdrew from the Premier Cup competition after four rounds due to a lack of numbers. It was decided that the games that had already been played involving the Balmain Dockers side would be voided. Moorebank Sports (formerly South West Sydney) entered an Under 18's side for the first time and their inclusion in the Under 18's Challenge Cup competition saw this competition consist of eight teams. The Second Division competition consisted of ten teams.

The draw for all competitions were finalised by Christmas 2007 utilising the AFL Software. Alana Shackleton and myself travelled to Melbourne in early December to receive the necessary training in the use of this software. This software is able to now be accessed from our offices in Sydney which is a significant development and one which will be advantageous in the future. All clubs were requested to submit any fixture requests. Other matters that needed to be taken into considerations included the Swans home draw, Drummoyne Oval and Sydney Uni No 1 Oval Rugby Union requirements & Henson Park Rugby League requirements. With the use of the software most of the clubs requests were able to be met. Unfortunately an issue arose involving a clash of dates with Sydney Uni No 1 Oval and St Pauls Oval which resulted in a number of our draws needing to be redone in January. Whilst this was inconvenient the new draws were completed with a minimum of fuss and were available within a fortnight.

The draw included a number of themed rounds which included "Super Saturday", Rivalry Round which coincided with the AFL's 150th Celebration of Community Football Weekend and Health Awareness Round which supported the Cancer Councils "Call to Arms" initiative.

The 2008 season commenced on April 5 with "Super Saturday". The event saw all Premier Division Senior teams playing at Henson Park over the one day. The first game commenced at 9:00am with the final game, a replay of the 2007 Grand Final between North Shore and St George, commencing at 7:40pm. The day was well supported by the public, although the support from some of the clubs was disappointing. All other competitions commenced on April 12.

All competitions consisted of 18 home and away matches, with two designated wet weather rounds. Four weeks of finals were required for the Premier Division and Under 18's Premier Cup competitions with the Grand Final played on September 20 at Henson Park. The First Division, Under 18's Challenge Cup and Second Division competitions had three weeks of finals with their Grand Final played on September 13 at Mahoney Park.

The majority of competition matches were played on Saturday, Saturday night and Sunday. Prior to their demise, the Balmain Dockers played an Under 18's Premier Cup match on Friday night, an innovative idea. The Premier Division Seniors and Reserve Grade match between Balmain Dockers and Western Suburbs was scheduled for Anzac Day, however wet weather forcing the closure of Drummoyne Oval prevented this match from proceeding as scheduled which was unfortunate as this is another great initiative and both clubs should be congratulated.

The Premier Division Finals were all played at Henson Park, except for the Second Semi Final which was played at North Dalton Park, due to Henson Park being unavailable. Unfortunately the final at North Dalton Park was diminished as a spectacle due to continuous rain in the days leading up to and on the day.

The First Division Semi Finals were played at Wagener Oval with the Preliminary Final played at Kelso Oval. The Grand Final was also scheduled to be played at Kelso Oval however Bankstown Council refused to allow AFL Sydney to use the ground, allegedly due to the Preliminary Final being played on the ground when it was supposedly closed. Council did not inform us that we would be unable to play the Grand Final at the ground and only sheer coincidence alerted us to the fact of the grounds unavailability on the afternoon of Grand Final eve. With short notice the game was transferred to Mahoney Park and credit must go to the catering club, Penrith, as well as all the competing clubs, umpires, spectators etc. for ensuring that not only did all Grand Finals proceed as scheduled but that it was also a very successful day.

Wet weather again played a part in 2008. However, apart from two Second Division final round matches, all other matches were able to be played or rescheduled to a wet weather weekend.

All five senior competitions were keenly contested at the top end however all competitions, apart from Premier Division Seniors, suffered due to a substantial difference between the top sides and the bottom sides in each division. This may have directly or indirectly resulted in an unusually high number of forfeits (16) during the year. A complete review of all senior competitions has commenced, with a restructure of AFL Sydney competitions to come in to effect in 2009.

A vast number of venues were again used in 2008 and, apart from the clubs normal home grounds, other venues used included Henson Park, Charles McLaughlin Reserve, Picken Oval, Kelso Oval, Pittwater No 5 Oval and Mahoney Park. Unfortunately the wet weather early in the year prevented the much anticipated opening and use of East Coast Eagle's new ground, Bruce Purser Reserve. The ground will definitely be ready for the beginning of the 2009 season. AFL NSW/ACT continues to invest in improving AFL Sydney facilities with two new grounds at Blacktown Olympic Park expected to be ready during 2009 whilst major works will also be completed on Drummoyne Oval, Gipps Rd Oval and Weldon Oval.

During the year three clubs were penalised for playing ineligible players. Southern Sharks First Division Reserves were stripped of their Round 13 win for playing a player who had not received a clearance from his previous club. Western Suburbs Under 18's Premier Cup side had their six wins taken from them, as well as being fined for playing a player under an assumed name throughout the year. Campbelltown Premier Division Reserves were fined for playing two players under an assumed name who were registered with another AFL Sydney club. It is the clubs responsibility to ensure that any player who takes the field is a registered player of that club. The playing of unregistered players could have serious ramifications for the club and club officials should a serious injury occur. Breaches of this nature will continue to be punished heavily.

Representative football again played a significant role within AFL Sydney with three games scheduled, as well as a post season International Rules games against the NSW Gaelic Athletics Association (NSWGAA). The Senior side played the Victorian Amateur Football Association at Henson Park, the Development side (23 years and under) played the Black Diamond AFL in Newcastle and a First Division Representative side represented AFL Sydney at the NSW Regional State Championships held in Wagga Wagga.

Three functions were scheduled during the year. A season launch was scheduled for March which included a Golf Day followed by a dinner. Unfortunately lack of club support forced this event to be cancelled. The Team of the Year & Representative Presentation Dinner was held at Club Swans, while the prestigious Phelan/Snow Medal Presentation Dinner was again held at the WatervieW Convention Centre. Both of these events were very successful.

Insurance for clubs, players and public liability was again taken out through JLT Sport as part of the National AFL Program.

The prescribed penalty system continued in 2008. The system meant that players who were reported were given the option of taking a set penalty rather than appearing before the tribunal. The reporting umpire completed a report template which was then assessed and converted into points and subsequently the number of weeks that the player would be offered under the Prescribed Penalty. There were a total of 84 reports in 2008 of which 69 were offered a Prescribed Penalty. 55 players opted to take the Prescribed Penalty.

In addition to the reports laid by the Umpires there were an additional five citings from the clubs. From these citings three players appeared before the tribunal, with all three players subsequently found not guilty.

2008 also saw two club officials and one club playing member found guilty of breaching the AFL Sydney Code of Conduct. All three offences related to inappropriate conduct towards an umpire or umpires official.

There were also two cases of Racial Vilification during the year. One case was settled via mediation whilst the other was heard by the tribunal, with the accused person found not guilty. AFL NSW/ACT will be holding an information seminar relating to racial and religious vilification prior to the 2009 season to make players and officials aware of their responsibilities in relation to this important issue.

Umpires were again supplied by the NSWAF Umpires Association and we thank them for their support.

In closing I would like to thank all those people who have assisted me in my role. In particular Bob Robinson, Alana Shackleton and Chris Mintern, the Club Presidents, Secretaries and Graham Glassford and the Umpiring Group.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT MANAGER'S REPORT

Club Development took another step in 2008 by providing programs and policies for willing clubs to ensure their own sporting environment was safe, secure and well governed. Also in Australian Football's 150th year we recognised the people that make our great game what it is today, our volunteers.

Some key points from 2008 were:

Health Awareness Round – August 9 & 10

The weekend of August 9 and 10 marked the second year of AFL Sydney's Health Awareness Weekend. The purpose was to promote and raise awareness of a disease that has the potential to affect all our players that take the field on any weekend in some way, mens cancers.

AFL NSW/ACT teamed up with the Cancer Council of Australia via their 'Call to Arm's' initiative which saw all players in all divisions take to the field wearing yellow armbands to create awareness of men's cancers. Clubs were asked to donate funds via a gold coin donation at the home clubs canteen on game day.

The total proceeds from the weekend were just under \$5000. Well done to all clubs who got involved in this initiative.

Club Development Month

One of the key new initiatives for Club Development this year was the implementation of Club Development Month. Each Wednesday in February clubs were invited to attend the following educational sessions to improve their club's off field standards:

Wednesday 6 th February – Sponsorship and Fundraising	- 35 attendees
Wednesday 13 th February – Financial Management	- 25 attendees
Wednesday 20 th February – Club Planning	- 35 attendees
Wednesday 27 th February – Good Sports (Drugs in Sports)	- 20 attendees

In season 2009 we will continue with Club Development Month. The feedback we received from the above modules was quite positive and will also ensure that some of these sessions are repeated in various areas of Sydney.

A big thank you must go to our guest speakers from the University of Western Sydney and Good Sports who delivered the sessions.

'Get that Grant' Sessions

In conjunction with the AFL NSW/ACT Facilities Department and in addition to our Club Development Month sessions, two sessions were delivered in relation to obtaining grants not only for the improvement of facilities but also for equipment or other smaller items. One session was held at the Sydney Football Stadium in May and the other session was held at Blacktown Olympic Park.

These sessions will be continuing again in 2009.

Club Development Report

A Club Development newsletter was introduced this year which contained information in regards to grants, training sessions and tips and hints on how to improve your club.

This was a monthly newsletter and will be continuing in 2009.

Regional Championships

To celebrate 150 years of Australian Football, twelve leagues from throughout NSW and the ACT made their way to Wagga Wagga for the inaugural AFL NSW/ACT Regional Championships on the long weekend in June.

The eventual winner of the Championships was the Riverina Football League while AFL Sydney took out the Division 2 Title.

This will become a bi-annual event with the next Championships to be held in 2010.

JLT Sport Insurance Program

Personal Accident and Public Liability Insurance was once again taken out via our Insurance Brokers, JLT Sport. For the fourth successive year, insurance premiums have remained the same whilst the coverage included under the cover had improved.

JLT Sport's Account Manager, Justin Gillingham, relocated to Sydney this year and delivered workshops through out the Sydney AFL community to explain the program

Volunteer of the Year – Ken Ferguson Award

Having quality and knowledgeable volunteers at football clubs ensures not only off-field success but also aids in maximising on field success. All the hard work a committee does in player/coach recruitment, ensuring its finances are in the black and organising game day operations goes a long way to ensuring on field success.

AFL SYDNEY UMPIRING GROUP REPORT

In 2008 the Sydney AFL Umpiring Group took another step forward in its journey to support the Sydney AFL competition. One of the greatest challenges is the culture between umpires and the clubs. There is no doubting there is a divide, which exists in most sports between officials and the participants. It is all part of the game, however for the game to flourish there is a total dependence on one another and for that alone we must all work together.

2008 challenged this cultural divide with the implementation of the Club Umpire Program which meant for the first time Premier Division clubs had to supply an umpire for the Reserve Grade games. There is no doubt that this initiative has uncovered a number of very good umpires into the game as well bridging the gap between umpires and participants from club land.

While in previous years clubs have had to provide club field umpires, this year saw a more professional approach in terms of education of those club umpires. In all 17 club field umpire courses were conducted from March to April by the Umpiring Department with in excess of 250 participants in all.

With the club umpire in formal operation the goal of the Sydney AFL Umpiring Group was to try and appoint a field umpire to every game. Unfortunately we did not succeed in our goal however we did take a step forward in being able to appoint to a number of games that in the past few years we would not have been able to. Working collaboratively with the club umpires I believe was successful and is a very good model to work from while the numbers of umpires do not meet the number of games being played.

There are a total of 58 field umpires, 24 boundary and 13 goal umpires on the AFL Sydney Umpiring Group list. The list size for 2008 has grown from 45 field umpires in 2007. The challenge is always to have all umpires officiating each week however that is not always possible with injury, work and family commitments being issues the umpiring group confronts. It is ever pleasing to have near on half the field umpiring panel aged between 18 and 25. Numbers of umpires attending training continues to increase which is encouraging. A study recently released concluded that the 'club environment' of an umpiring group was the single most important factor in retaining umpires.

Shrinkage in the number of goal umpires this year is a concern and in the off season a concerted recruitment effort will be implemented by the Umpiring Department to boost numbers.

The Umpiring Department continues to work closely with the Greater Sydney Junior Umpiring groups to ensure that umpires who wish to progress from beyond junior football are given every opportunity. A major role of the Umpire Development Officer has been to work closely and promote umpiring as a real alternative. There is no doubt that programs such as the Sydney Umpiring Regional Squad and the NSW/ACT Development Academy are important pieces in developing umpires throughout the region.

This year we also trialed a program with Endeavour Sports High School by creating an Umpiring School Based Academy. This was a weekly program conducted with in the school to train students in umpiring Australian Football. Students within various sports including athletics, oztag and of course football were given the opportunity around the middle of the year to be a 'Green Shirt Umpire' running the boundary in AFL Sydney. The relative success in this pilot will see the potential for a number of schools to be involved in 2009.

For any group, be it playing or umpiring, the two most important qualities are the environment and the approach both of which are generally set by the coaching staff. This year our goal was to have every umpire reviewed at least once throughout the season and with up to 32 games being played each weekend this presents a challenge for the coaching staff. I must personally thank Keith Ogston and Simon Harrison in particular for taking a greater involvement when I was called away to Canberra over the later half of the year. Thanks must also go to Ken Ray, Greg Lyons, Stewart Eckerman, Nick Angelos, Richard Cox, Andrew Jones and our Strength and Conditioning Coaches Michael Hetherington and Matthew Tuck for all their efforts over the season.

It is also pleasing to be able to announce that Matthew Gestier has been selected to trial as a Field Umpire for the AFL. Matthew becomes the first AFL Field Umpire to trial in NSW/ACT that has come entirely through the NSW/ACT system. This achievement will only help other aspiring umpires to believe that AFL Sydney is a viable competition to gain entry to the AFL.

In 2008 four umpires were part of the AFL Umpiring Panel, Adam McDonald, Luke McSpeerin (Boundary), Segio Villagra (Goal) and Mathew James (Field) who moved to Sydney midway through the season.

The Umpiring Department continues to work hard at building the base of umpires to ensure it caters for the growth of the game at all levels. By engaging the junior groups and the introduction of recruitment programs like School Based Academies we are building the base of umpires that over the next few years will translate into a greater increase in the number of senior umpires in the AFL Sydney competition.

SPONSORSHIP/APPROVED SUPPLIERS

AFL NSW/ACT was again the major contributor to the funding of the AFL Sydney competition.

In December 2007 AFL NSW/ACT held a Trade Show at the SCG Indoor Cricket Centre. 31 companies took the opportunity to have a stand at the Trade Show which was attended by Representatives from 68 clubs within AFL Sydney and AFL GSJ, as well as the 11 Affiliate Leagues throughout NSW and the ACT.

PUBLICITY

A concerted effort was made at the beginning of the season to try and improve the level of media coverage given to AFL Sydney. The major newspapers and radio sports programs were approached without success, although on several occasions during the year the competition had match details published in the "What's on" sport section of the Sunday Telegraph. An approach was also made to the Cumberland Newspaper Group who publishes quite a number of regional newspapers and this approach was well received with a number of regional newspapers running regular AFL stories.

The International Rules fixture received media coverage throughout the local and national media in October. The scholarship program has also been used to draw attention to AFL Sydney.

The major newspapers continued to publish the results and details of AFL Sydney matches in their Monday editions whilst the Daily Telegraph also published the Premier Division Senior Team Lists in their Saturday edition.

The AFL Sydney website continues to be our best form of publicity and, through the efforts of the website administrator, Alana Shackleton, the website continues to be our main means of communication with the football world.

The website now includes a significant amount of additional information, both current and historical. The photo gallery contains images from AFL Sydney matches throughout the year (courtesy of Michael Vettas) and events (courtesy of Peter Davies).

AFL NSW/ACT Media and Communications Coordinator, Jess Reis is looking to improve the coverage and presence of the AFL Sydney competition in 2009.

CLUB FIELD UMPIRES

2008 saw the introduction of the Club Field Umpire Program (CFUP).

Whilst club umpires have been required in lower grades for a number of years the CFUP was introduced to provide a more professional approach to club umpiring and involve all clubs.

The program involved the following:

- All Reserve Grade (Premier Division & First Division), Under 18's Challenge Cup and Second Division matches officiated by an appointed umpire (where possible) and a Registered Field Umpire from each club.
- To become a Registered Club Field Umpire the club umpire would need to either hold a current umpire accreditation or attend a club umpire training seminar. They would also need to complete a Club Field Umpire Registration Form.
- Upon registration the club field umpire received a registration card, AFL Sydney match day pass, Laws of the Game DVD, 2008 Laws of Australian Football, AFL Sydney Club Umpire Manual, and red/yellow cards.
- Clubs were provided with Green/Black shirts, black socks and a whistle for the umpires. Clubs were to provide them with white shorts.
- A minimum of two umpires required for any game to commence.

Prior to the season commencing, AFL NSW/ACT Umpires Development Officer, Carl Fletcher conducted 17 CFUP training seminars throughout Sydney. As a result of these seminars 260 club personnel registered to become a Club Field Umpire.

During the year 94 of these people umpired at least one game, whilst 32 umpired in excess of five matches.

The first season of the CFUP was considered a success and continued improvement of the program is expected in 2009.

PHELAN MEDAL NIGHT

Over 400 people attended the Phelan/Snow Medal Presentation Dinner held at the Waterview Convention Centre, Bicentennial Park on Monday September 15, 2008. Hosted by Mark Beretta, the night recognised the achievements of individuals, volunteers and clubs who excelled during the 2008 season.

All past Phelan Medal winners were invited along with Life Members, members of the NSW AFL History Committee and sponsors. Each Premier Division Club was represented by at least two tables and First Division Clubs by one.

Digital Sports provided the audience with a fantastic presentation which included video and photographic highlights from the 2008 season. A full vote count was conducted for all Premier Division Seniors games. Matthew Carey from Pennant Hills was named the winner of the 2008 Phelan Medal with 17 votes in what was a close contest. The presentation also featured a count of all three vote getters in the First Division Seniors competition with Andrew Davis from UTS winning the 2008 Snow Medal. In all other divisions the top ten vote getters were acknowledged. Part humorist, part folkie, half hippy, half bogan, part Victorian and completely South Australian Greg Champion performed for the crowd.

The 2008 Ken Ferguson Award for Volunteer of the Year was awarded to Bob Sterling from St George while other awards presented on the night included the leading goalkickers for all divisions. The winner of the 2008 AFL Sydney NAB Rising Star was Western Suburbs' Mitchell Frail who received a trophy and \$500 cheque from NAB. The Club Championship award for both Premier and First Division was presented to UNSW/ES and University of Technology respectively.

Three new members were inducted in to the Sydney AFL Hall of Fame at the event. John "Osie" Grose was represented by members of his family while Anthony "Tony" Quinn and Chris O'Dwyer were in attendance along with family and friends to celebrate their achievements and contribution to AFL in Sydney.

PHELAN MEDALIST

Matthew Carey made it back to back Phelan Medalists for Pennant Hills when he polled 17 votes to win the prestigious award by one vote from Sydney University's Alex Lee with Wollongong midfielder Adam McConnochie a further two votes back in third position.

The 22 year old wingman polled in nine matches, with three best on ground performances, including back to back games in Rounds 15 & 16 against Wollongong and Balmain Dockers respectively to put him in a tie for the lead with Lee. One vote in Round 17 against East Coast gave Matthew the lead and with neither player polling a vote in the final round Carey was declared a popular winner.

Luke Jarjoura was the pace setter picking up 11 votes in the first six rounds, however he was ineligible to win the award after his suspension in Round 9. Lee was a consistent vote winner in the middle of the year and he joined Jarjoura at the top of the leaderboard in Round 13 and maintained the lead, or a share of it, until Carey overtook him in Round 17.

Carey emulated the 2005 performance of Dean Davies who won both the Phelan Medal and a Premiership Medal in the same year when he lined up for Pennant Hills against East Coast Eagles in the 2008 AFL Sydney Grand Final.

AFL SYDNEY NAB RISING STAR

Mitchell Frail from Western Suburbs was named the 2008 AFL Sydney NAB Rising Star at the 2008 Phelan/Snow Medal Presentation Dinner. Adjudged by the Premier Division Coaches, Frail (20 votes) won the prestigious award by one vote over Sydney University's Brydon Coles and North Shore's Teddy Strudwick.

2008 was the 198cm 18 year olds first full year of AFL coming over to the game from a rugby, cricket and athletics (was ranked seventh in Australia in Under 20's high jump) background. Mitch played eleven games for Western Suburbs and kicked seven goals and shows improvement in every game he plays.

Frail was part of the 2008 NSW/ACT RAMS program as an over-age player, playing a pivotal role in their win over Victoria Country. He has also played for the Swans Reserves this year.

Mitch is an exceptional talent making rapid progress and showing signs of a big future in the game. Mitch's terrific work ethic has seen him become an integral member of the Western Suburbs senior side.

Mitchell received a trophy along with a \$500 cheque from NAB.

HALL OF FAME

In 2003 Sydney AFL established a Players' Hall of Fame. Nominees are judged by the selection committee to have made an outstanding contribution to the AFL Sydney competition.

The Hall of Fame is principally for players with the following criterion used in the selection of inductees:

- Level of service and overall contribution to the game
- The number of playing years is a consideration but not the sole determining factor in assessing a person's eligibility
- A player may only be eligible to be inducted as a Hall of Fame member once they have been retired from playing for a minimum period of three years
- Only those who have played in a senior competition in Sydney are eligible.

In 2008, three new members were inducted in to the AFL Sydney Players' Hall of Fame:

John "Ossie" Grose came to Sydney from Kempsey in 1942 to join the Newtown club (1942 – 1958). A 5' 2" rover, "Ossie" was a key player in the Blood Stained Angels premiership team that year and went on to play in another six premiership teams for Newtown (1945 – 1950) in a "golden age" for the club. "Ossie" played over 200 games for the Newtown club and held various leadership and coaching roles in the 1950's. He also represented NSW on seven occasions including the 1947 ANFC Carnival in Hobart. Described in the press as "the best rover in Sydney" during the 1940's, accounts as recorded in the Football Record and in newspaper articles of the time indicate that "Ossie" was one of the best players of his era. "Ossie" was represented by his son John and grandchildren at the 2008 Phelan/Snow Medal Presentation Dinner on Monday September 15.

Locally born **Anthony "Tony" Quinn** played with the St George Juniors and St. Pats Sutherland before joining St. George Senior club in 1984 where he played 194 games, retiring in 1997. Tony was the 1993 Phelan Medalist and named St George's Best & Fairest in 1989, 1993, 1994 and 1995. Tony represented NSW on four occasions and the Sydney League on five occasions. Senior Captain from 1992 – 1996 inclusive, Tony was admitted as a life member of St George in 1995 and to the Club's Hall of Fame in 2007.

Chris O'Dwyer played his junior football in Barooga before going to Assumption College in 1988/89. Chris played with the Sydney Swans in 1990, 1991, 1992 (& later in 1995) before joining Eastern Suburbs where he played 168 games between 1993 and 2000. The 1994 Phelan Medalist (28 votes, 83 for his career) represented the Sydney League on five occasions and was named Best & Fairest for Eastern Suburbs on four occasions. He captained the club in 1996, 1999 and 2000 and was playing coach in 1997 and captain coach in 1998. In recent years Chris has served on the Campbelltown AFC committee and played a leading role in bringing together the Regional Committee for the Sydney South West Region as part of AFL Greater Sydney Juniors.

TRIBUNAL

The tribunal, which was held on a Wednesday night at the AFL NSW/ACT offices, met on 17 occasions during 2008. Brian Langton acted as Tribunal Chairman while the other six members of the tribunal panel operated on a roster basis.

In comparison to 2007, charges in 2008 were down by 10%. In 2008 81% of all charges were offered a Prescribed Penalty of which 80% were accepted. This percentage increased from 2007 where 75% of charges were offered a Prescribed Penalty with 67% accepting. In 2007 & 2008 67% of those cases which appeared before the tribunal resulted in a guilty verdict and the player was subsequently suspended.

REPRESENTATIVE FOOTBALL

In 2008, the AFL Sydney Representative program was expanded to include fixtures for the Senior side against the Victorian Amateur Football Association (VAFA), Development Side (23 & Under) against the Black Diamond AFL (BDAFL) as well as a First Division side who contested the NSW Regional State Championships. An International Rules match was also played in October against the NSW Gaelic Athletic Associations (NSWGAA).

Seniors

With regular Representative opponent AFL Canberra committed to playing in the Australian Country Football Carnival, AFL Sydney accepted an invitation to play the VAFA at Henson Park on June 8, 2008.

Danny Ryan was appointed coach following a decision by former coach Mark Drinkwater to stand down. Danny was assisted by Richard Gerke and Daniel Kenny. Leigh Forsyth, Trevor Clisby, Peter Wood and Garry Burkinshaw were appointed as selectors along with the coaching staff.

A selector was in attendance at every Premier Division Senior game in the lead up to the Representative match. At the completion of Round 5 a training squad of 35 players was selected. All players were notified of their selection via phone and email/letter. Only two players from the original squad declared themselves unavailable which is a marked improvement on previous years and an indication of the players commitment to Representative Football.

The squad trained five times at Henson Park which, on most occasions, was well attended. Each training session was attended by trainers Bruce Hunter, Cassie Parker and Russell Penton as well as Physiotherapists James Sutherland and Rebecca Riley-Ward to ensure that all injuries and ailments were well managed. The input and professionalism of these five people was much appreciated by the players.

The squad was reduced to 25 in the week prior to the match and on the Tuesday night prior to the game the squad gathered at the SCG for a massage, pool recovery session and game plan meeting. The squad also had a team dinner at the Azure Café where Gary Jack presented the players and officials with their playing gear, representative shirt, polyfleece jumper and bag. At the team dinner Alastair Richardson was named captain of the side.

Ron Wason was ruled out of the side with a hamstring injury and two other players were omitted at the final training run at Henson Park on Thursday night. Despite Ron's disappointment he still offered to run water for the side which was much appreciated.

The side failed narrowly to win the match (see report below) however performed creditably. Following the match the physiotherapist took the players through a warm down including "ice baths" which was well received by the players. One major injury occurred from the match with David Coupe tearing a pectoral muscle which required surgery and saw him miss nine weeks of football. All other players were able to play for their clubs the following week.

The players progressed to Wests Rules Club for the after match function, which included finger food and refreshments.

Presentations took place at the function and included a trophy for the best player of each team as decided by the respective coaches. Phil Entwisle won the award as the Best Player for AFL Sydney.

The representatives of both AFL Sydney and VAFA also exchanged mementos (AFL Sydney – Jumper; VAFA – Tie).

The VAFA had a significant amount of support at the match as well as the after match function.

Match Report

VAFA held of a late AFL Sydney charge to by five points at Henson Park, 13.8.86 to 11.15.81.

Played in overcast and occasionally drizzly conditions on a fantastic playing surface, AFL Sydney kicked the first goal of the game through a Mark Skuse snap. VAFA hit back with goals to Leigh Hendra, Justin Arnold, Adam Pirrie and Andrew McGuinness. AFL Sydney were working hard with Declan Donohue and Phill Entwisle doing a fine job in defence while Dwain Watkins was tireless in the middle. An excellent snap from Dane Rampe and a scrambling goal from Alex Lee saw the home side go into the first break trailing by just seven points.

The second term saw AFL Sydney gain the ascendancy with Luke Jarjoura and Jason Coulloupas starting to take control of the centre whilst Angus Darling was nullifying the impact of the VAFA bigmen. Troy Luff moved forward in the second term and responded with two goals from strong marks. Matt Carey also proved dangerous around goals and managed to kick two goals for the term which saw Sydney open up a 22 point lead. VAFA managed to also kick two late goals through the agency of McGuinness and Marty Pask and in doing so reduce the gap to 10 points at the long break. Sydney suffered a blow in the second term with Troy Bartlett being forced out of the game with a corked thigh.

VAFA came out after half time full of fire and took control of the game, dominating the stoppages and kicking three goals for the quarter through Pirrie, Mark Paterson and Ben Doherty. Strong defensive work also prevented AFL Sydney from kicking a goal in the third quarter and the visitors led by six points at the final change. Sydney can thank the defensive work of Entwisle, Donohue, David Coupe, skipper Alastair Richardson, Kieran Wright and Chris Noordhoff which allowed them to remain in touch with one quarter to go.

Coach Danny Ryan urged his charges to keep working hard however the visitors got the important first goal of the last quarter through Arnold's second. A snap goal from Pirrie saw the VAFA extend the lead to three goals however AFL Sydney were not done yet. Jon Vlatko kicked a goal from a mark following an excellent smother from Rampe to keep them in touch and this was followed by Luff's third goal. The VAFA responded with a goal to Doherty followed by an excellent goal on the run from Patterson which saw them extend the lead to 17 points with five minutes to play. AFL Sydney refused to give in and when Darling and Vlatko both goaled from marks the difference was just five points. AFL Sydney were able to gain possession with Richardson marking 70 metres out from goal but unfortunately the siren sounded at this point. Richardson had an unlikely shot for goal after the siren however the distance was too great and the VAFA had recorded a five point victory.

Each training session was attended by trainers Bruce Hunter, Cassie Parker and Russell Penton as well as Physiotherapist, James Sutherland to ensure that all injuries and ailments were well managed.

The squad was reduced to 24 (the game was 24 per side) in the week prior to the match and this group participated in the final training run. The squad travelled by bus to Newcastle on the morning of the match and returned following the match. The bus was supplied by North Sydney Coaches.

In a high quality match the side recorded a good win (see match report). A down side of the match were the serious injuries suffered to James Keogh (ankle) and Pat McBride (wrist). James was required to go to hospital after the game and after five hours received treatment and was able to leave. James was accompanied to hospital and driven back to Sydney by Bob Robinson. They arrived back in Sydney at 11pm. Pat had to have surgery on his wrist and both he and James unfortunately missed the remainder of the season.

After the match the players and officials progressed upstairs for the after match function courtesy of the BDAFL. An award for the Best Player was made with Alex Goodall being the recipient.

Match Report

The AFL Sydney Development team withstood a second quarter goal scoring blitz from the Black Diamond AFL before winning 21.20.146 to 19.13.127 at Newcastle No. 1 Sportsground. Alex Goodall was presented with the trophy for best on ground, whilst Dane Rampe kicked eight goals in a dominant display up forward.

It was an entertaining match played in front of a good crowd. The ground was presented in excellent condition which was a pleasure for the AFL Sydney players.

Sydney opened up kicking with the advantage of a slight breeze and quickly got the scoreboard ticking courtesy of a snap from Dane Rampe. Key Black Diamond forward Mick Ryan answered for the home side before Matt Carey kicked a brace of goals for Sydney. Sydney were winning the midfield battle and their slick ball movement was worrying the Black Diamond and two more goals to Rampe and one to Bartlett on the siren allowed Sydney to go into the first break with a 28 point lead. The Sydney midfield of Dwain Watkins, Ben Mankarious and Alex Goodall were working well whilst defenders Mark Irving, Phill Entwisle and skipper Max Collett were doing a good job down back.

The Black Diamond made some positional changes for the second quarter and with a more physical attack on the ball started to take control of the game. Ryan was proving a handful up forward and in partnership with Michael Kemp and skipper David Flynn managed to kick eight of the eleven goals for the home side during the quarter. Sydney responded with four goals themselves but still trailed by 17 points at half time. Further worries for Sydney was the rising injury toll with James Keogh carried from the ground with an ankle injury whilst Entwisle and ruckman Pat McBride both had to leave the field after receiving head cuts.

Sydney had the advantage of the wind, which had picked up its strength, in the third quarter and with McBride on top in the ruck and fiercer attack on the ball they were able to once again get the upper hand. The move of Collett on to the ball worked a treat as his physical presence made a difference and he was also able to get forward and kick two goals. Seven goals for the quarter saw Sydney lead by 17 points at the final change however the Black Diamond had the use of the breeze in the last quarter.

With the game on the line the young players really stood up and with superior leg speed were able to control the game for much of the last quarter, despite kicking against the wind, and outscore their opponents. Rampe dominated the game to kick three goals for the quarter to take his tally to eight for the game whilst Luke Stanford, Steve Wilsen and Mark Skuse also had positive influences on the game. For the Black Diamond, Ryan took his tally to seven with two final quarter goals. When the final siren sounded AFL Sydney had recorded a good 19 point victory.

First Division

2008 saw AFL NSW/ACT conduct the inaugural NSW Regional State Championships in Wagga Wagga on the June long weekend. It was the first time a carnival of this magnitude was held as it involved all AFL NSW/ACT affiliate leagues (except Broken Hill). Kristy also travelled to Wagga Wagga with the squad and her input and professionalism was much appreciated.

Following the final training session the club had a team dinner at Wests Rules Club where Simon Laughton presented the players and officials with their playing gear, representative shirt, polyfleece jumper and bag. At the dinner Kurt Hayward was named captain of the side.

In addition to the players and officials Glen Callaghan of the NSWAF Umpires Association also made the trip as the field umpire representing AFL Sydney.

The trip to Wagga Wagga was by bus, engaged from Port Stephens Coaches. The coaching staff kept the players busy on the trip which engendered a firm sense of comradeship amongst the group.

Accommodation was at the Country Comfort Motel in the centre of Wagga Wagga and upon arrival the squad went to Rivcoll Oval for a light training run.

A team dinner was held on the Friday Night at the Victoria Hotel.

Match day saw the side win their three pool matches and take out the Pool B Championship. AFL Sydney then went on to play the Hume League in a cross over game on the Sunday (See match report).

On Saturday night the players attended the Championship function which saw the trophies presented to the winners of Pools B and C as well as the individual best players for each team. Tyrone Armitage was awarded the best player award for AFL Sydney.

After the match on Sunday the players enjoyed some free time. Some of the group decided to return home whilst others stayed out and sampled the local nightlife.

The squad assembled on Monday morning (albeit some in better form than others) for the trip back to Sydney. The bus arrived in Sydney in the late afternoon.

Whilst the trip could be classed as a success on the field with the team winning the Pool B title, unfortunately the off field behaviour of a number of members of the touring party left a lot to be desired.

There were allegations of unruly drunken behaviour throughout the trip commencing Friday night which resulted in complaints from guests who were staying at the motel. There were also allegations regarding damage to a motel room whilst the trophy was destroyed.

An investigation into these allegations was undertaken. As a result of this investigation the players responsible for the damage to the motel room were required to pay for the damage whilst representative football for First Division players has been suspended indefinitely.

International Rules

Danny Ryan was appointed Coach assisted by Richard Gerke, Daniel Archer and Daniel Kenny whilst Adrian Raftery provided his International Rules knowledge at most training sessions.

A squad of 35 players was selected for the match, with selections based on AFL Sydney Team of the Year members then players considered to be suited to International Rules. Of the 35 players chosen, 14 players were unavailable which resulted in three players being added to the squad at the last moment.

In addition to the above, four NSWAF Umpires Association umpires also made themselves available for the game:

Central: Damian Anderson, Boundary: Michael Saunders and Goal: Andrew Scovell and Anthony Mitchell.

The players had four low key training sessions with the main emphasis being on getting used to handling the round ball as well as the rules. Following the final training session the players and officials had a team dinner at the Alexandria Hotel.

The players were provided with a jumper (which they returned after the match), short, socks and a pair of compression tights (courtesy of 2XU).

The match was a high quality affair which saw AFL Sydney win by the narrowest of margins (see match report). After the match the Mike Raftery Cup was presented the Alastair Richardson and players from both sides adjourned to Dirty Nellie's pub in Paddington for the after match function.

The International Rules concept was well received by players and supporters alike and could become a regular fixture on the AFL Sydney calendar.

Match Report

The International Rules concept was a winner when AFL Sydney and the NSW Gaelic Athletics Association (NSWGAA) clashed at Mahoney Park on Saturday October 18, 2008. In front of an enthusiastic crowd, AFL Sydney prevailed by the narrowest of margins to win the Mike Raftery Cup. Final Score was AFL Sydney 4.3.10 (43) to NSWGAA 3.6.6 (42).

The match began in ideal weather and ground conditions with the AFL side having the better of the opening, playing a high tempo game built around a lot of run and handball. As expected, their tackling worried the NSWGAA side and they were able to create a number of turnovers through this method. At the first change AFL Sydney had established a ten point lead.

The second quarter started in a similar fashion and when Matt Carey and Kieran Wright were able to record goals, AFL Sydney had opened up a twenty point lead and the game threatened to be a blow out. Not to be denied though, the Irish side hit back and by using their strength, kicking the ball to position, they were able to dominate possession and subsequently field position. One goal and three overs saw the home side reduce the margin to five points at the long break.

The hectic pace of the game saw the interchange benches working overtime and fitness was going to be important towards the end of the game.

The third quarter saw the AFL side again have the majority of possession however, poor disposal into their forward line saw the Gaelic side repel many attacking forays. Damien Bowles was moved forward in the third quarter and this proved a masterstroke as he contributed all AFL Sydney's points in the quarter; one goal, an over and three behinds. NSWGAA responded with two goals of their own and entering the final term the AFL side led by just four points.

The final quarter was a tight affair as both teams, and their supporters, strived for the win. AFL Sydney got an early goal courtesy of Ron Wason following good lead up work from Dane Rampe. The NSWGAA strived for the important goal however they were thwarted on a couple of occasions by excellent goalkeeping from Blake McGrath. In the end the AFL were able to hold on to their lead and record a one point victory.

In a match where almost all players contributed at some point, Ron Wason was arguably the best player on the ground, taking telling marks and making attacking runs from defence before moving forward in the last quarter and kicking an important goal. Mitch Frail used his height and athleticism to advantage, Luke Stanford attacked the ball with ferocity and picked up numerous possessions whilst skipper Alastair Richardson was superb in defence starting numerous attacking forays with hard running whilst also repelling many of the NSWGAA attacks.

At the conclusion of the match Alastair Richardson was presented with the Mike Raftery Cup.

The match was well contested, played in excellent spirit and an excellent spectacle. The players commented on the quickness of the game with very few stoppages in play. Following today's match this is certain to become a regular fixture on both the AFL Sydney and NSWGAA calendars.

FINALS

Premier Division Finals

2008 saw the Premier Division Finals consist of the top five finishers after the completion of the home and away season.

The Elimination and Qualifying Finals were played at Henson Park on August 30 and 31. This was followed by the First Semi Final at Henson Park and the Second Semi Final at North Dalton Park on September 6 and 7. Henson Park hosted the Preliminary Final the on Sunday September 14 before the Grand Final was played a week later on Saturday, September 20.

The second semi final was played at North Dalton Park as Henson Park was unavailable. Unfortunately the day was marred by rain which fell on the Friday preceding the match as well as all day on match day.

All final days featured three matches with the Premier Division Seniors, Reserves and Under 18's Premier Cup matches scheduled.

Catering for the AFL Sydney finals is allocated on a rotating basis and in 2008 it was Balmain Dockers turn to undertake the catering at Henson Park. They paid a catering levy to the League of \$2,000. I am certain that the club would have benefited greatly from this arrangement which would be a just reward for the effort that they put in. With the Second Semi Final being held at North Dalton Park, Wollongong was allocated the catering for this day.

Campbelltown were appointed the Gatekeeping duties and they completed this task with great diligence. The club received 25% of the gate keeping proceeds. Due to the poor weather at North Dalton Park, no gate was charged for the Second Semi Final.

The admission charge for all finals was \$5 for adults with children Under 16 free. An additional charge of \$5 was applied to park inside the Henson Park grounds. Each participating team (including umpires) received 32 player/official entry passes as well as two car parking passes. Football Records were given away for free.

The finals were well supported with reasonable crowds although it is disappointing that more people do not make the effort to attend the finals.

The weather for all finals was mixed with the Elimination, Qualifying and First Semi Finals all played in fine weather. The Second Semi Final endured poor weather conditions whilst the Preliminary Final endured showers throughout the day. The Grand Final was played in summer conditions with the temperature at 31degrees.

A highlight of the finals was the condition of Henson Park which, despite the weather, was presented in excellent condition each day. The money spent on the ground in the off season was a worthwhile investment and the players and spectators all appreciated the conditions. Thanks should be passed on Marrickville Council for their efforts during the finals series.

The Premiers were presented with individual player medallions and the Premiership Cup in the front row of the grandstand. The presentations were completed with the assistance of West Coast Eagles CEO Trevor Nisbett (Under 18's Premier Cup), Craig Davis (Premier Division Reserves) whilst Ross Howarth presented the Premier Division Seniors Premiership Trophy. Ross also presented the Rod Podbury Medal to Scott Reed from Pennant Hills as Best on Ground in the Premier Division Seniors Grand Final.

TELEVISION COVERAGE

AFL Sydney continued to gain national exposure with highlights of one AFL Sydney Premier Division match shown twice each week on the FOXTEL Aurora Channel (183).

The one hour program was shown on Wednesday nights at 9pm and repeated on Saturday morning at 8am. The program consisted of highlights of the selected AFL Sydney match of the week.

The match of the week was selected to ensure that all clubs received exposure during the year. Towards the end of the season the focus was on televising the match of the round.

Ratings received from Aurora show that, on average, the show reached 22,000 viewers each week.

In addition to the FOXTEL program each match of the week was also available for viewing via the AFL Sydney website. This medium was courtesy of Graeme Kelly "The Video Guy" and received on average 1,520 hits per week. The most viewed match was the representative match between AFL Sydney and the VAFA.

Our broadcast partner, Digital Sports provided "live streaming" of the Premier Division Semi Finals, Preliminary Finals and Grand Final. This was a great initiative and one that could no doubt be expanded on.

Digital Sports should be commended on the quality of the production and presentation and it is hoped that this exposure will continue in years to come.

FOOTYWEB

In 2008 clubs continued to utilise Footyweb for the following:

- New registrations
- Maintenance of Membership Database
- Provision of Weekly Team Lists
- Inputting of Matchday details (home team only)

One change in 2008 was that only new Under 18's Registrations required inputting in to the membership database. This is the same procedure currently in place for all senior players. This change saved club officials a significant amount of work.

At the completion of each match day the home club was required to input the details (i.e. scores, goalkickers & best players) for all matches played on that day by 9pm. Once input, the Football Operations Officer would then upload the information on the AFL Sydney website. It was not uncommon that by 7pm, results details from all AFL Sydney matches played on that day available for viewing. Clubs should be congratulated on their efforts.

The Senior Football Operations Officer would also complete an eye check on the information submitted once the matchday paperwork was received.

Footyweb will be further enhanced in 2009.

CLUB OF THE YEAR INCENTIVE SCHEME

The Club of the Year incentive scheme was enhanced in 2008 to give clubs the opportunity to receive financial rewards for achieving excellence for off field administrative tasks. These tasks included provision of financial information, attendance at meetings and matchday duties. Items relating to discipline (both on and off the field) and representative football were also included in the scheme.

Points were allotted for each task, each worth \$0.50 to the club.

Each week points were calculated and clubs issued with a statement.

At the end of the season, clubs were paid the amount which they earned, up to a maximum of \$2,000 per club. Clubs must have achieved a minimum of 1,000 points to be eligible to receive a payment. If a club finished with a negative amount they would be required to pay this amount.

It was pleasing to note that all 20 clubs were eligible to receive a payment with four clubs; East Coast Eagles, North Shore, Pennant Hills and Wollongong receiving the maximum amount of \$2,000.

The incentive scheme is an excellent initiative that saw \$26,467 returned to the clubs.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP AWARD

In 2008 a Club Championship Award was awarded to the leading Premier Division and First Division Clubs based on their on field performance of their top three grades.

Points were awarded as follows:

Seniors: 6 points for a win; 3 for a draw, 0 for a loss

Reserves: 4 points for a win; 2 for a draw, 0 for a loss

Under 18's/Second Division: 2 points for a win; 1 for a draw, 0 for a loss

If a club only had two teams their total points have a 10% weighting added to them.

The winning teams were presented with a perpetual trophy at the Phelan/Snow Medal Presentation Dinner whilst the winner of Premier Division Club Championship award also received \$2,000 whilst the First Division Club Champions received \$1,500.

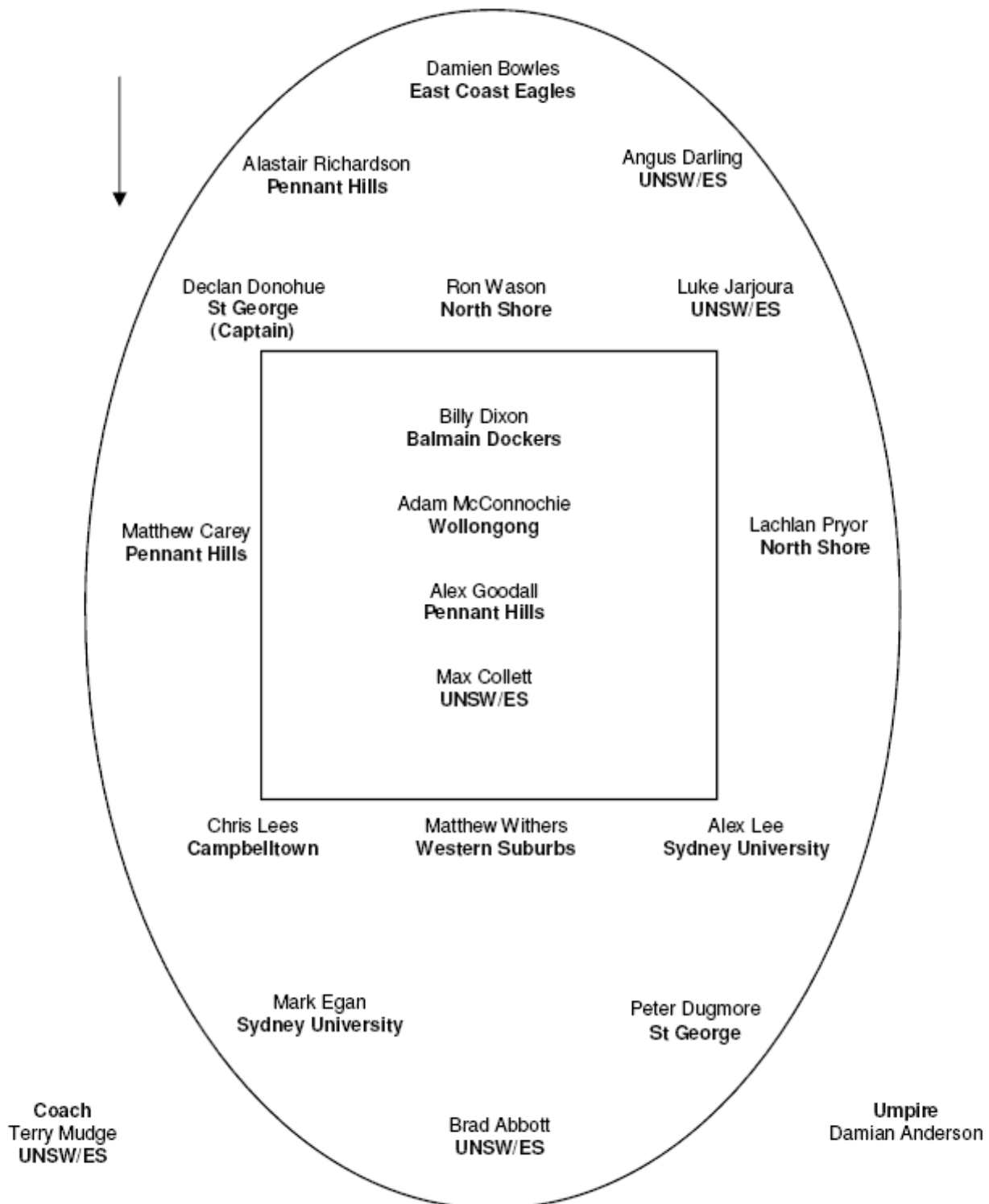

THE FOOTBALL RECORD

The production of a weekly Football Record continued in 2008 and was expanded to include both the Premier and First Division competitions.

Clubs were again asked to contribute notes each week. The notes were placed adjacent to their team list and home clubs were issued with 50 copies each round.

The publication was compiled and edited by Alana Shackleton and Garry Burkinshaw, who would lodge a copy with Officeworks, Gosford on Wednesday Morning. Once printed and collated, the A5 booklets were collected that afternoon, sorted and boxed into home club lots and couriered to the house of a home club official each Friday.

Officeworks provided a 5% discount for the inclusion of an advertisement in the Record.

The season's records will be bound and kept as part of the leagues historical records.

Whilst there is a reasonable effort in publishing the Football Record the end result is a tremendous vehicle for the league and clubs to push their cause and a wonderful effort for those concerned in its publication.
